

# **DUKE ELLINGTON PANORAMA**

#### Exhibition

The Maison du Duke present a panorama that embraces life and work of one of the great geniuses of the twentieth century.

Pianist, composer, arranger, bandleader, Duke Ellington (1899-1974) has maintained its Orchestra for 50 years (a record), and produced an extraordinary number of masterpieces. Author of several thousand compositions, much of which has greatly enriched the repertoire of jazz, he was surrounded by the best soloists who helped to define the inimitable Ellingtonian color, refined blend of impressionism and roughness Jungle.

In addition to a detailed historical chronology, the exhibition hoghlight his soloists and its alter ego Billy Strayhorn. She recalls her many appearances on the screen depicts his special relationship with France and emphasizes the intense radiation of his music

today. In the twelfth and final panel, are revealed unusual aspects of the Maestro. Many documents (from Philippe Baudoin), some very rare, a soundtrack (frome Claude Carrière)

illustrate the panorama.
